### **Bird Talk**

I cannot recall the garden, the church yard nor the Church Farm fields looking so bleak, wet, grey and lifeless; but nor can I recall being more grateful for them being there.

If one looks carefully there is actually life. The bulbs are poking through, there may already be snowdrops visible and the aconites will be along shortly. But one doesn't even have to look carefully to see the abundant bird life that is daily carrying on its noisy and colourful routine, oblivious to Covid, the lock down or insurrection on Capitol Hill – how reassuring.

I have written about this before but am now devoid of words to describe the benefits I, and I know many others, get from the birds and the landscape. The media, the commentators, the therapists, the experts on well-being, the trend setters have used them all up; by overuse they have sucked the meaning out of them leaving only hollow shells – uplifting, energising, nurturing, stimulating, refreshing, calming; they have been cliched out of my vocabulary in this context.

My fear is that post the Covid crisis our current high level of awareness for things natural declines and we slip back into past indifference to what we are doing to our environment. My hope is that positive developments will emerge from this pandemic, one of which will be a long-lasting awareness of both the general and specific benefits we get from nature. This surely will prompt us to slow the rate of destruction, perhaps even venturing into more aggressive restoration. On a global scale, thank goodness the USA has re-joined the Paris Agreement.

Now, what of the birds? In our garden there is nothing unusual but there is plenty of what there is. Tits, blue and great, goldfinches, many many energetic cheerful sparrows, dunnocks daily, occasional wrens and blackbirds. I mentioned in the last Pump that, for the first time in twenty years, we had for some weeks had no blackbirds in the garden. They are now back and gorging on the plentiful ivy berries which they love. There is also a solitary robin who is often on the fat balls which is unusual in my experience.

Sparrows, like humans, are fickle. My neighbour, Linda Breeze, usually has loads of sparrows but at the moment, none. Our gardens back on to each other and I am happy to share the birds with her so we know not what is happening. There are plenty to go around this end of Church Lane, so I hope they return to her feeders

soon. May be a sparrow hawk has been lurking, but our gardens are so close it would surely scare our birds as well - a mystery.

Another fickle bird is the starling. They used to love fat balls but they haven't been on them for months. They still roost in reasonable numbers on the large ash tree beside Roger and Lesley Pigerham's house, so I watch them occasionally through my binoculars.

The Suffolk Wildlife Trust tell us to look out for redpolls in our gardens at this time of year. Crudely described, at this time of year they are like smallish dumpy sparrows with a red patch on the head but actually more attractive than this description. I haven't seen one here for a number of years, but it would be interesting to know if anyone else in the village has seen any.

More exotically Miles Davis saw over 100 redwings on the cricket bat willows beside the Lark with some fieldfare on the ground. I don't think there is anything for them to eat on willow trees, but it must have been a splendid sight. He also saw two Egyptian geese on the flooded fields between here and Jude Ferry.

Finally, Rob has printed a waterscape by Pat Gates showing the state of the path to the foot bride. Unfortunately, the redwings weren't there at the time but it is still a great photo. *Don MacBean*

## Save Ferry Drove!

It has come to the attention of the Parish Council that the route connecting Worlington and West Row, commonly known as Ferry Drove, is not recorded as being a Public Right of Way, despite it being a popular route for walkers, cyclists and horse riders. The reason this is important now, is that the government has said that all such routes must be formally recorded by the end of 2025 on a document known as the "definitive map", otherwise those public rights of use will be legally removed. We are now working in partnership with West Row Parish Council to apply for this route to be recorded.

As part of the application, we need to supply as much evidence as we can of public use over as many years as possible, and part of this process involves asking current and past users to complete a "user evidence form" to record such use. Therefore, we are now appealing to anyone who has ever used the route to contact us ASAP, so that we can ask you to complete a form and help us try to save this route for current and future generations. But before I do that, I would like to say a big thank you to the Rev'd Sandie Barton for all that she has done for this parish in the 9 years that she has been your parish priest. I look forward to working with all in this parish to build on the great legacy that she has left.

I live in Mildenhall and moved here with my wife, Jenny, about 3½ years ago when I retired from being vicar of churches in the East Riding of Yorkshire. We moved here to be nearer our daughter and her family, which includes our 3 grandchildren, and they live about 10 minutes walk from where we are. We also have a son who lives with his wife in a small village between Inverness and Aberdeen in Scotland. I was ordained nearly 14 years ago in Ripon Cathedral and served my curacy in a Team parish on the outskirts of Leeds. From there we moved to the East Riding parishes. Before ordination I spent 30 years working for one of the Yorkshire building societies being based at various different places in Yorkshire. Indeed, Jenny & I spent all our married life in that county before moving to Mildenhall. My hobbies are bellringing, birdwatching and I have been doing a lot of walking since the start of the first lockdown mainly in the areas along the river.

I have been asked to look after the four parishes of the Lark & Lee Group on a temporary basis until a permanent replacement for Sandie is appointed. I will be licenced to the post, along with all the other Team Vicars in the new Forest Heath Team, at a service, which will necessarily be held on Zoom because of the pandemic, that will take place on Thursday 11th February in the evening. I look forward to being your new Team Vicar and to working with you all. If there is anything you think I can do then please contact me. Having mentioned services, I would just like to explain the situation with services at this time of lockdown. As our government's key advice is for everybody to stay at home your PCC & I have decided that we should not be holding services in All Saints until the lockdown has been withdrawn. We will review the situation then. This does not mean that God's Church has shut down! We are all still here seeking to do his will and we will be continuing to worship him using Zoom on-line in conjunction with the other 3 churches of the Group and the people of the Beck Row Group. At the last 2 Sunday services on-line we have had more than 80 people worshipping together! If you were not one of those and would like to join us then do let me know. In the meantime, All Saints will be open on Wednesdays and Sundays for those who would like to visit for a time of private prayer. If you do visit the Church then please follow all the COVID guidelines including wearing a facemask when in the Church.

## Sunnica Update

Firstly, we would like to thank everyone who has written letters, emails, had a board in their garden or has completed the Sunnica consultation questionnaire. Our thanks also to all involved in the Stand Together for Wildlife, Energy and Community webinar, which was so informative and engaged many people. The response from our community has been amazing, and it is good that so many more people are now aware of the potential issues around the Sunnica proposal. We now await the submission to the Planning Inspectorate - possibly Q2 (Apr-Jun), which will be accompanied by numerous weighty documents in which Sunnica should show how they have taken into account the issues raised by both statutory consultees and the general public.

Once the plan goes before the Planning Inspector the public has 28 days to register as an Interested Party in order to present their views directly to the Planning Inspectorate. Please be ready to respond to this deadline as it may happen before the next issue of the Parish Pump is available. **Anyone** affected in **any way** by the proposal can register as an Interested Party. There is a useful short video on the Planning Inspectorate website about how to register (<https://infrastructure.planninginspectorate.gov.uk/application-process/participating-in-the-process/>). Once registered, you will be kept up-to-date about the application and have the opportunity to attend site meetings or the open floor hearing (but you are not required to speak).
