Bird Talk - Guest Contributor

Welcome to Julian Bhalerao who is the nephew of Robert Bright's wife Jackie. Robert and I were chatting about birds and Robert told me about Julian who is an ace birder. I got in touch with Julian and this uplifting article and stunning photographs are the result.

My name is Julian Bhalerao. I'm in my fifties and live in North Norfolk with my wife Sarah and our two children. I have been a dedicated birder for most of my life and have travelled widely in search of birds and other wildlife. Seven years ago everything changed when, completely out of the blue, I suffered a massive stroke.

After a lengthy stay in hospital I was allowed home but my life had completely changed. I was now partially paralyzed and had suffered significant sight-loss. Pursuing my beloved hobby of bird-watching and photography was going to be very challenging due to my new circumstances. I decided the best thing to do was to concentrate on watching the birds in my garden. I could carry on my extensive physiotherapy regime in the comfort and warmth of my kitchen and keep an eye on the birds in my garden.

Sarah relocated the bird feeders to a more suitable position and I found by heaving myself out of my wheelchair and edging myself against the kitchen sink I could see almost all of the garden. Observing the daily movements of the birds was great therapy for me. It improves my mental wellbeing, helps me manage my remaining eyesight and helps my physio exercises especially my legs as I have to stand for long periods to check the bottom of the garden.

I am fortunate to have lots of birds visiting the garden at different times of the year. Winter is the most productive time as natural food is scarce and the birds are attracted to the feeders in the garden. Numbers of local birds are augmented by migrants from Scandinavia. Sarah puts apples out in the Autumn and Winter. These are popular with our resident Blackbirds and also tempt migrant Redwings and Fieldfares to visit.



In recent winters we have been visited by an increasing number of Blackcaps with a maximum of three last winter. The Blackcap usually a summer visitor to Britain's woods and hedgerows. It is a slim Grey Warbler. The male has a black beret whereas the female's is brown. They will eat apples and other fruit but

will also try fat or seeds from my feeding station. The numbers of Blackcaps choosing to spend their winter in Southern Britain seems to be increasing. Milder winters help their survival as does all of us who put food out in our gardens.

Blackcaps would traditionally migrate to sub-Saharan Africa to spend the winter but they seem to be doing very nicely by not undertaking a long and hazardous migration twice a year. Do look out for them in your garden but be aware they can be quite fast-moving and sneaky as they try to evade the Blackbirds and get to the apples first. I have two in my garden currently and I expect to see them until March when they will disperse to find mates and hopefully breed. They breed in front of my house and in April I can hear the rich song of the male advertising his territory.

It's always a thrill to find something a bit different in the garden. Most of the other birds don't seem to mind the Blackcaps. The Finches and Tits will let them onto the feeders. The Blackbirds chase them off the apples if they are not too busy squabbling with each other. Our resident murderous Sparrowhawk is too slow to catch them. I will keep doing my hours of physio but I always have my camera close by as I'm still trying to get the perfect shot.
