Naldera Mary Hill "Bubs" - A Eulogy

"A little dynamo with a zest for life and a love of laughter, a kind heart and a lovely person". Words from her son Stephen.

The following is taken from the Eulogy given by the venerable John Cox.

Naldera Mary are names many of us do not recognise - we only knew her as Bubs. It was a childhood nickname given as a baby because she blew bubbles.

Bubs was born in West Row where her parents ran a grocery and drapers shop. Her two sisters were considerably older than Bubs and there was a lot of love lavished on this baby of the family. On Sunday the family went to Chapel where her mother played the organ. Once when enemy planes were heard overhead her mother just played louder! One member of the extended family was involved in the finding of the Mildenhall Treasure and at Christmas the great silver charger was used as the family fruit dish.

To John (her husband), Bubs was the discovered treasure. He was in the R.A.F. and looking for an evening out went to a party where he met Bubs who had moved to Baldock to work in a munitions factory. They married in 1947.

When John retired from the R.A.F. in 1964 they moved to Worlington and bought the house where she lived for 53 years.

Naldera is the name of one of the oldest golf clubs in India. Both John and Bubs played, Bubs becoming Ladies Captain and a member of the County Second Team. She was also a keen tennis player. Bridge was another enthusiasm, and she loved her garden and was proud of it to the end.

Bubs was a proud person - not in that way which wants to make out how important you are; but in the quiet way of taking trouble about your appearance, of enjoying company but not wanting to be dependent or a nuisance to others. Of being your own person, and having standards. She was house -proud and when sons Stephen and Christopher were at home used to chase them for the natural untidiness of boys.

The loss of Christopher was a huge sadness.

Dear Friends

Recently PM Theresa May announced a snap election in June, and in a rare show of unity the entire nation seemed to let out a loud groan. Not that we don't love democracy of course, but it's the prospect of weeks of wall-to-wall pundits dominating the news, politicians kissing babies and saying anything, anything at all in order to win our vote but with no intention of sticking to their word once in power, sound bites, photo opportunities, smear campaigns, and all so soon after the last lot.

It's little wonder that many people have become cynical about the whole democratic process. I feel I should perhaps apologise for even mentioning it. But my excuse is that interestingly the PM and the leader of the opposition both released Easter messages urging us all to draw on Christian principles as we face the future. What can they mean?

May mentions compassion, community and citizenship, which she reckons she picked up during her vicarage upbringing. Corbyn for my money gets a whisker closer with social justice, peace and reconciliation. All nice things. It's hard to argue with any of it, but as both are quick to point out, people of other faiths and none are equally prone to have all those principles. They are basically just the principles of decent people everywhere. So why bother bringing up Christianity at all? Can we know how Jesus would have voted?

Jesus himself never got the opportunity to vote as he didn't live in a democracy, but in a country oppressed by a cruel invading force. He never openly opposed that force, though he did have a few choice words to say about hypocritical religious leaders; but clearly his teachings were seen as dangerous and subversive, so much so that the Romans feared an uprising, and executed him.

I think Jesus' problem with the electoral system might be that it tends to encourage selfishness: we look at the various manifestos and work out which will make us better off, not others. Why would I want to risk paying more taxes so that people I'll probably never meet can benefit? And so we have created a system in which everyone seeks their own best interests - the very opposite of what Jesus taught.

For the real thrust of Jesus' message was not just decent, vicarage style principles, but radical love for God alongside radical love for others. The kind of love that determinedly puts the needs of others before our own, goes on loving in the face of hatred, gives more than is asked and goes on giving till the pips squeak. The reality of Christian life, even in vicarages, even in churches, is one of struggle and weakness as we do our darnedest - and all too often fail - to live out those very simple principles. I doubt if you'll hear any politicians talking about that as they try to win your vote.


