## Bird Talk

It has been a dull time in our garden since the last Pump with nothing unusual showing up. There is plenty of activity with sparrows and tits devouring the nuts and black sunflower seeds as usual but I am concerned by not having had a single blackbird in the garden so far in November. I can not recall this ever happening before so I wonder if anyone else has noticed an absence of blackbirds?

A friend recently visited the British Trust For Ornithology's (BTO) reserve at Thetford and said that the hedge rows were thick with black birds so maybe they have all gone there. I hope that this means that the reason for the dearth in my garden is that there is plenty of fruit in the wild; I certainly hope so.

I was also some weeks without our dunnocks but I am now pleased to be seeing a couple scuttling busily around under the feeders. While on ordinary garden birds, a lady who has recently moved from Maidstone in Kent to Bury St Edmunds has joined the University Of The Third Age's (U3A) bird group. Because of Covid we haven't been having outings so we haven't actually met her yet but she has sent us an interesting email comparing the garden birds she was used to seeing in Maidstone with what she is now seeing in Bury.

The main difference is sparrows! In Maidstone she had to go into the countryside in the hope of seeing just a few but now she has them aplenty in her own garden. Refreshing to find someone getting a thrill out of what I see as commonplace, but also a reminder that it is unwise to take for granted elements of the natural world we are fortunate enough to have around us.

The current dullness in my garden extends to the local area and I haven't seen a single migrant this year which is disappointing. I keep reading about them else where and as near as Bury so I don't think there is anything sinister here, just my bad luck or poor observation technique.

Looking for some stimulation last week I went Isleham mere to see if there was anything there. As I arrived a flock of about fifty lapwings flew up off the water and did not come back; but at least I saw them and I haven't seen them in numbers there or around the Lark for ages. I have mentioned before that within the last fifteen years flocks of over a hundred used to roost throughout the winter on fields round the village – so sad.

There were four dunlin, one heron but not a single redshank which is usually an ever present there. The highlight was a flock of over sixty teal which kept taking off, flying around and landing again. It was a brilliantly sunny morning with a clear blue sky so as they wheeled round in circles their silver undersides glittered in the sun producing an arresting display.

There are often fieldfare and redwing on the hedge rows and fields around the mere but on this occasion, nothing. Other than rooks, there was not a single bird of any description on the fields, bushes or trees around the mere which is unusual.

However, the mere is only an easy cycle of four point three miles from Worlington so it is worth a visit as there is invariably something to make the trip worth while.

Another trip that might be worth while is to the Suffolk Wildlife Trust’s reserve at Lackford Lakes. This is the time of year for large murmurations of starlings to gather on the reed beds there and there are reports that they are picking up momentum. This happens at dusk and is a spectacular sight which enthral both adults and children.

I know the sparrow hawk is not everyone’s favourite bird but predators are part of nature and their well being or otherwise can indicate the health of the species they prey on. For ten years BTO surveys have reported a decline in sparrow hawks but this year their Garden Birdwatch survey is indicating an increase in sightings in gardens. This could be due to a number of reasons but it is encouraging to think that if sparrow hawks are doing well in gardens then garden birds are also likely to be thriving.

## Census Day 21<sup>st</sup> March 2021

'Preparations are in hand for the 2021 Census, the national exercise held every ten years which provides information for Government use in making decisions, for example in funding of services. The Census will be held on Sunday 21<sup>st</sup> March 2021. All households in the country will be asked to answer a set of questions, if possible online, about everyone in that household on that day.

This Census will be digital first but paper copies and support will be available for those that need it. Security is strict, both in handling your data and in making sure the process is COVID-19 safe. The Office for National Statistics (ONS) which runs the census in England and Wales, is independent from Government. Your details are protected by law and information published is always anonymous. The full record is held in a vault for 100 years before it is made available for genealogists. You will be sent an access code in the post and can fill your return in online as soon as it arrives, in early March. If your household circumstances change on Census Day you can let ONS know. Guidance on completing the survey will be released in due course and you can find more information at <https://census.gov.uk/>.

## **West Suffolk Local Plan – Issues and Options consultation 9am Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> October - 5pm Tuesday 22<sup>th</sup> December**

The issues and options consultation documents will be available to view as soon as the consultation starts at <https://westsuffolk.inconsult.uk/>. You do not need to register to view the documents but you will need to register to send your comments. This is the most efficient and effective way to send your views.

Responding through the online consultation system provides a number of benefits:

- You can enter your comments as you read through the document, paragraph by paragraph and answer the questions directly into the document
- You will be able to view other people's comments after consultation closes and they have been accepted
- You will be automatically notified when new documents are available for consultation
- You will be able to update your own personal details and areas of interest.
- You will be able to join and leave consultations at any time during the consultation period
- It is cheaper and quicker

Although it is preferred for you to use the online system, comments made by email or letter will still be accepted. These will be summarised by the policy team and entered into the online system so that other people can see them and they can be included in reports. Unless you are registered you will not be able to view other people's responses. Anonymous responses will not be accepted.

The issues and options documents that are being consulted on are:

- West Suffolk Local Plan – Part One – Developing a Spatial Strategy
- West Suffolk Local Plan – Part Two – Local Issues
- West Suffolk Local Plan – Part Three – Settlements
- Sustainability Appraisal
- Habitats Regulations Appraisal
- Sustainable Settlements Study

Public consultation events - due to COVID-19 they are unable to hold public consultation events at this time, however, they are running an online virtual exhibition between 13<sup>th</sup> October to 22<sup>th</sup> December 2020. The virtual exhibition will be open for anyone to join and you will have the chance to read through information, ask the project team questions and provide feedback via the council's online consultation system. You will be able to access the virtual exhibition from 13 October by clicking the link on the consultation homepage.

Live chat will be available with planning officers in the virtual exhibition space during the consultation period. There will be additional hours for live chat on launch day 13 October: 10am-12pm and 2-6pm. But generally live chat will be 10am-12pm and 4pm to 6pm on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays. On the consultation closing day, the live chat will be available 10am-12pm and 2-5pm.

The consultation closes at 5pm on Tuesday 22 December and they are unable to accept any comments submitted after that time. 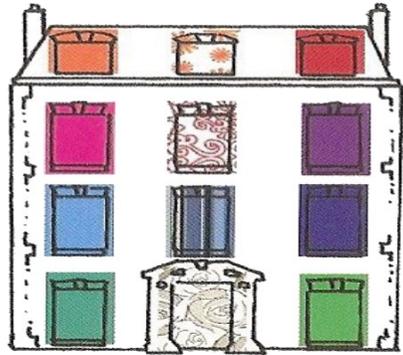
